It often helps to write as your work, so write down formulas and equations, solve math problems, outline, paraphrase and underline to help you read. Many of the commonly used tests, such as the Wechsler Intelligence Scales, have an average score of 100 and a standard deviation of 15. The ACEs quiz gives no insight into whether an individual child might be more or less sensitive to adversity and asks no questions about whether there may have been any protective relationships in place to help buffer the child from stress. These scores range from 1 to 9, with 5 being average. Test results are also often used to gauge how well a child is doing and to decide if a child needs extra help in specific areas.
